***START**

3769 Main Street

Starting on the north side of Richards Avenue (Gulf Gas Station), heading north on Main Street. Includes both sides of street.

3770 c.1870 Herrick House. Front Gable, 2-story, late Victorian influence. Built by Josiah Crandall.

3772 Lavine building. Had been built as a factory, now apartment house.

3784 Residence at top of hill.

3785 c.1840 The Pillars, Previously the Elms, built by Col. Thomas Gray.

3802 c.1867 St. Cecilia's Rectory. Neo-Classical Italianate. Formerly Burhans private bank.

3804 c.1875 St. Cecilia's Church

3797 Emerson Town Hall, built in 1965. At the top of the hill behind it sat Burhans Mansion which had been built in 1865 from stone quarried from Hackensack Mountain.

3805 Cumberland Farms

3806 St. Cecilia's Hall

3809 c.1880 Alexander Baker Funeral Home, formerly the McCarthy's Tourist Home.

3812 Maple Tree Books

3814 Dentist Office

3815 1-story residence

3816 c.1830 Greek Revival 2-story Front Gable. Among most intact. E.W. Howard Building.

3819 c.1899 Victorian style Manse & c.1840 Church. Originally Gothic Revival, altered to Queen Anne style. Presbyterian Church. The original 1888 organ still works.

3822 c.1850 Italiante style. Season's B&B includes a late 19th Century barn. Built by E.W. Howard for son Daniel.

3826 c.1830 Greek Revival. Emerson House B&B. Includes a large late 19th century barn. Built for Civil War Col. Samuel T. Richards.

3827 Stewarts Shops - LOST Previously c.1840 Greek Revival known as the Cunningham House. Another building on this property was moved to corner of Library & Milton Avenues.

3831 c.1880 Greek Revival with Victorian entrance. Abanakee Wellness Center. Also a rear outbuilding.

3835 c.1870 2-story house. L shaped.

3836 Tops, Dollar Store & Subway. LOST ~ Built by Pelatiah Richards, c.1932. Later became Gilchrist Manor.

3839 c.1830 Greek Revival ~ Russell House.

3844 c.1870 Baptist Parsonage

3847 c.1870 Victorian. Miles Thomas House. Now Senior Citizen Building, owned by the Town of Warrensburg.

3850 Baptist Church LOST ~ Original 1876

3852 TD Bank North. Built in 1954 as an Atlantic Service Station.

3853 c.1927 Glens Falls National Bank. Originally Emerson National Bank.

3856 Warrensburg Laundry and H&R Block

3857 Insurance Building. Former office of H. Reoux

3861 c.1860 commercial building, originally Emerald Pasko's store.

3864 Rite Aid. LOST ~ Site of Adirondack House built 1825 and later Colonial Arms.

3867 c.1929 Colonial Revival Bandstand/Floyd Bennett Park. Floyd Bennett navigated Admiral Byrd on the first flight to the North Pole.

At five corners turn left on to Elm Street

66 c.1885 Victorian style. Lockwood Residence.

58 c.1899 LOST ~Warrensburg News Office

56 c.1880 Victorian 2-story gable front residence. Porch is a more recent addition.

54 c.1880 Victorian period detailing. Bertrand House.

52 c.1880 1½-story Victorian Cross Gabled Design.

51 LOST ~ Former Barn to Miles Thomas House

50 c.1905 reflecting Queen Anne and Colonial Revival styles. Includes outbuilding at the rear of property. Built by Frank Hasting

49 Blue house

46 Ranch house. LOST ~ c.1901 Large Queen Anne shingle style built by Louis Weinman for his daughter and son-in-law Isaac Hart Joseph.

45 Yellow house

44 c.1905 Known as the Dr. Cunningham House

42 c.1905 Dickinson House Residence built by Jim Hall (includes a small outbuilding.)

43 c.1920 Bungalow style, known as G.W. Dickenson House

41 c.1920 Bungalow style residence. Includes a rear outbuilding.

39 LOST ~ Site of original Warrensburgh Academy c.1854

36 c.1900 Richards Library. Colonial Revival. Native Granite. Note: addition to the rear was not included. The library was paid for by Richards sisters Clara and Mary.

32 c.1915 2-story wood frame residence.

28 c.1850 2-story wood frame. Built by Burhans, Gray & Co.

27 c.1900 Champlain Stone. Note: the addition on the south was not included. Includes an outbuilding in the rear.

26 c.1850 Greek Revival workers cottage. Built by Burhans, Gray & Co.

24 Elm c.1850 Greek Revival workers cottage. Built by Burhans, Gray & Co.

21 White house

19 c.1870's Carpenter Gothic. Burhans Guest House

18 c.1934 Firehouse. The Fire Company started in 1921 with 15 Charter members.

17 Beige house

17 Pine Tree Lane
Burhan's Stable and Garage

7 Pine Tree Lane
Red Building /Church (Pine Tree Lane)

8 c.1880 Residence ~ 2-story side gable, stone foundation.

7 c.1860 French Second Empire, The Elms Caretaker cottage.

4 c.1869 1 ½-story wood frame with Queen Anne modifications.

2 c.1840 Riverside Gallery with Queen Anne modifications. In 1918 it became Sturdevan's Bakery.

1-LOST ~ Vacant lot. Barn was included, but has since been removed. Originally site of building prior to 1880 when it became Osborne Corner Store
